### **Cleaning the Cookware**

#### **Before First Use**

Wash your new Saladmaster cookware to remove all traces of any manufacturing oils and polishing compounds prior to first use.

- 1. Prepare warm, soapy water in kitchen sink.
- 2. Add 1 cup (250 ml) of vinegar per one gallon (3.8L) of water.
- 3. Wash each piece of cookware, including detachable handles. in water solution.
- 4. Rinse in clear, warm water.
- 5. Dry thoroughly with a clean. soft towel.

### **Cleaning the Cookware**

#### **Daily Use Cleaning**

Cleaning your cookware on a normal basis after cooking is easy with Saladmaster.

- 1. Remove detachable handles.
- Wash cookware and handles in warm, soapy water.
- 3. Rinse in clear, warm water.
- 4. Dry thoroughly with a clean, soft towel.
- Avoid using abrasive cleaning tools and cleansers on the high-polish surfaces. This can impact the look and dull the finish over time.

- As the Vapo-Valve<sup>™</sup> is precision cut to integrate into the cover, be careful when cleaning or drying the edges of the valve.

Alternatively, your cookware can also be placed in the dishwasher.

- 1. Remove (unscrew) knob from cover prior to placing in dishwasher.
  - Cleaning knob in dishwasher can impact the look and dull the finish over time
- 2. Do not use high temperature setting when using dishwasher. We recommend using below standard temperature.
- 3. Avoid using abrasive dishwasher detergents. It can cause the rim to become rough.
- We recommend only hand washing the detachable handles and cover knob. Avoid using abrasive cleaning tools or cleansers.

# For Stubborn Stains or Stuck-on Food

Use our Saladmaster Powdered Cleaner when you have stubborn stains or stuck-on food that remain after normal cleaning.

- 1. Rinse pan with warm water.
- 2. Sprinkle the powdered cleaner on the inside of the pan.
- 3. Using a damp paper towel, rub the powdered cleaner across the surface in circular motions creating a paste.



- Avoid using abrasive cleaning tools and cleansers on the high-polish surfaces. This can impact the look and dull the finish over time.
- 4. Wash well in warm, soapy water to remove all cleanser.
- 5. Dry with a clean towel, soft towel.
- 6. Rinse and dry with a clean, soft towel.
